Friday, 7/09 – Arrive at starting point and camp just past highway 50 near South Fooses Creek.

Saturday, 7/10 – South Fooses Creek to Marshall Pass about 10-12 miles depending on where we are camped, there is a short steep climb at mile 8.5 to the top of the Continental Divide 11,920

Sunday, 7/11– Marshall Pass to Sargents Mesa, 15.2 miles

Monday, 7/12 - Sargents Mesa to North of highway 114, 16.5 miles

Tuesday, 7/13 – North of highway 114 to Saguache Park Road 17.8 miles you can chose to end at this segment or continue on to San Luis Saddle.

Wednesday, 7/14– Layover Day at Saguache Park Road,

Thursday, 7/15 – Saguache Park Road to Eddiesville Trailhead, 13.7 miles

Friday, 7/16 – Eddiesville Trailhead to San Luis Pass, 16 miles. We will get trailers and it is your choice to stay until Saturday

The Colorado Trail 2010 – Ride of a Lifetime!

Come join us on a beautiful catered ride through the Colorado Rockies along the scenic Colorado Trail. This year our ride will begin at South Fooses Creek just past highway 50 and will cover approximately 92 miles to San Luis Pass. We will be camping for 7 nights, riding for at least 6 days if you choose to ride the whole trail. We will gather, organize, park our rigs and camp on Friday July 9th at South Fooses Creek. We will ride Saturday through Tuesday, with a "layover" on Wednesday at Saguache Park Road where people can day ride, fish, visit, spend a leisure day at camp. The ride will continue on Thursday for 2 more days to the last campsite at Cascade Creek just to the North of San Luis Pass. On Friday after 16 mile ride you can choose to stay or drive home. This year's ride will take us along segments 15 through 20 as described in "The Colorado Trail" guide book.

Please be aware, this is not a training ride! The terrain covered can be serious, strenuous mountain riding. As an example, on this years ride we have 3 days where we ride anywhere from 15.2 to 17.8 miles and climb to an elevation of 12,600 well above tree line. All participants must be able to get their own horse over various mountain obstacles; including all types of water crossings (large and small streams, little ditches with water, eroded stream beds with rock and/or mud, etc.). You and your horse must be in condition to handle the challenge of climbing majestic mountains and steep descents into high country valleys. The views will be spectacular and the memories will last forever!

Catering is courtesy of volunteers from The Front Range Back Country Horsemen and The Colorado Trail Foundation. We will also provide the cooking equipment, portable showers, outhouses, and equipment to move your personal gear to campsites. All food and beverages (including wine and beer) and horse feed (certified grass hay and basic grain) is provided. All participants must provide their own personal items including tent, sleeping bag, tack, etc. Everyone must also set up their own tent and help with camp chores. More information will be provided to registered riders as it becomes available. The cost will be \$595.00 for each rider for 6 days, \$450.00 for 4 days. All proceeds above the actual cost of the food, gas, feed, equipment, etc., will be donated to The Colorado Trail and Front Range Back Country Horsemen. A deposit of \$100.00 per rider is required with your registration. Payment in full is due by **July 1st** and actual costs plus the deposit are non-refundable after this date.

Please be flexible as the ride can be subject to change due to trail or road conditions.

The ride will be limited to 18 riders. Sign up soon to reserve your spot!
